In Memoriam

It has been 15 years since the untimely passing of our beloved board member,



Daphne Sawyer-Dunn. A scholarship fund was established in her name at the Paul School for the Blind in Bo. At the start of each school year, FoSL provides \$250 to the school to assist needy

students with school fees.

This year, the FoSL Board of Directors wanted to mark this 15th year anniversary with a special gift. The Paul School will receive \$1000 from our projects fund, which will provide the students with uniforms and toiletries, as well as fuel for their school bus. Petrol prices have



increased dramatically in Sierra Leone, as they have everywhere. This gift will enable the school to lock in the fuel supply to keep the bus in service.

New Agriculture Initiative

The Friends of Sierra Leone are teaming up with **RPCV** and FoSL members, Chris and Jeannie Siegler, on an innovative agricultural project in Mamaka Village just outside Mile 91, on the road from Freetown to Bo, in Yoni Chiefdom. The village will donate labor and 150 hectares of land for this 3-year project. A total of 45 farmers, 15 of them young men and 30 women, are enrolled in this program. They will be given loans using the micro-finance model, repaying the loan at 5% interest from the sale of crops and animals, and will receive instruction in farm finance, managing cash-flow, animal husbandry, and organic farming. Counselling and mentoring will also be provided.

The program is being directed by Ahmed "Muckson" Sesay, who as a young man, was instrumental in bringing the warring parties in Sierra Leone's civil war together for peace talks. Muckson has since earned a master's degree and is now a trustee at the Central University of Sierra Leone (ccmtsl.com) in Mile 91. An entrepreneur with experience managing micro-finance projects, he is very excited about the possibilities of this program.

The goal of this project is to bring Sierra Leone out of subsistence farming and make it a profitable venture. Keeping young men employed in the village, while increasing food security in the country is a win-win for any program.

At an early age, Sister Moran became a member of First African Baptist Church in Harris Neck, Georgia. She remained a devoted and active member until her health declined. mother, and grandmother. She helped with the rearing of her grandchildren and they always showed their love for her.
